

RUSSELL SPRINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING
REGULAR MEETING

The Russell Springs City Council held their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, October 11, 2018 at 6:00 p.m., in the Council Room at Russell Springs City Hall. Those in attendance were Mayor Eric Selby, Council Members David Blakey, Timothy Hudson, Eddie Thomas, Ricky Barnes, Sherry Daniel, Larry Skaggs, City Attorney Matthew DeHart, Police Chief Joe Michael Irvin, ABC Administrator Jeramy Coffey, ABC Investigator Brian Stephens, and City Clerk Christopher Ramsey.

Opening prayer was led by Mr. Larry Skaggs

WELCOME: Mayor Selby called the meeting to order and welcomed all those present.

MINUTES: Mayor Selby presented the minutes from the regular meeting held on September 13th. **Councilman Skaggs made a motion to approve the minutes with Councilman Barnes seconding. The vote was unanimous.**

CASH DISBURSEMENTS & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS: Mayor Selby submitted cash disbursements and financial statements to be approved. **Councilman Hudson made a motion to accept the cash disbursements and financial statements with Councilman Thomas seconding. The vote was unanimous.**

2nd READING OF AD VALOREM TAX ORDINANCE 2018-06
Councilman Thomas made a motion to accept Ad Valorem Tax Ordinance 2018-06 with Councilman Hudson seconding. The vote was unanimous

Halloween Hours: Mayor Selby said the plan is to have Trunk-or-Treat, October 31st between the hours of 5-7pm. Police Chief Irvin also gave a report on a backup plan in the case of bad weather.

RUSSELL COUNTY AIRPORT BOARD – COURTESY VEHICLE: Mayor Selby had a request from the Russell County Airport Board for a surplus vehicle. Mayor Selby said he had checked with Chief Irvin about donating one of the old police cars and Chief Irvin was ok with it. Councilman Thomas requested if we do donate the vehicle to the county that all City of Russell Springs decals be removed from the car. **Councilman Thomas made a motion to donate a surplus police car to the Russell County Fiscal Court (Airport Board) with Councilman Skaggs seconding. The vote was unanimous.**


