RUSSELL SPRINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING REGULAR MEETING THURSDAY, DECEMBER 13, 2018 6:00 P.M.

The Russell Springs City Council held their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, December 13, 2018 at 6:00 p.m., in the Council Room at Russell Springs City Hall. Those in attendance were Mayor Eric Selby, Council Members David Blakey, Timothy Hudson, Eddie Thomas, Ricky Barnes, Larry Skaggs, Sherry Daniel, City Attorney Matthew DeHart, Police Chief Joe Michael Irvin, ABC Administrator Jeramy Coffey, ABC Investigator Brian Stephens, and City Clerk Christopher Ramsey.

Opening prayer was led by David Blair

WELCOME: Mayor Selby called the meeting to order and welcomed all those present.

MINUTES: Mayor Selby presented the minutes from the regular meeting held on November 8th. Councilman Skaggs made a motion to approve the minutes with Councilwoman Daniel seconding. The vote was unanimous.

CASH DISBURSEMENTS & FINANCIAL STATEMENTS: Mayor Selby submitted cash disbursements and financial statements to be approved. Councilman Blakey made a motion to accept the cash disbursements and financial statements with Councilman Hudson seconding. The vote was unanimous.

CITY EMPLOYEE INSURANCE: Mayor Selby informed the council Anthem BCBS health insurance plan will be increasing 5% from last year, however an 8% increase had been projected in the current budget. The health insurance is scheduled to renew on January 1 if the council so chooses. Councilman Skaggs made a motion to renew with Anthem BCBS for another year with Councilman Barnes seconding. Motion Carried 6-0.

911 INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT: Mayor Selby let the council know that the current 911 agreement with the Russell County Fiscal Court and the City of Jamestown had come to an end and it was time to renew. Councilman Blakey made a motion to renew the 911 Agreement for another year at the cost of \$25,000 dollars with Councilman Hudson seconding. Motion Carried 6-0.

Councilman Blakey presented a gift to Mayor Eric Selby on behalf of the Russell Springs City Council for his service to the City of Russell Springs. Mayor Selby thanked everyone and gave a brief address to those present.

ADJOURNMENT: Councilman Skaggs made a motion to adjourn the meeting with Councilman Hudson seconding, All was in favor.
